Championships

Dancers are required to perform the mandatory number of bars in Preliminary and Open Championships (48 bars for the reel and treble jig, and 40 bars for the slip jig and hornpipe).

All championships will dance 3 rounds. Open, Preliminary, and Advanced Adult Championships will include a set dance of choice. Adult Championship will dance traditional sets.

For U9 and younger Prelim and Open Champ age categories, set dance round is traditional set dance only. If combined with U10 or older, they may dance a non-traditional set.

Requirement: "Sevens" reel step (16 bars) down the line. (*NOT your normal reel steps)

Every dancer will dance 7's to the right, followed by two 3's, then 7's to the left, followed again by two 3's. The step is then repeated on the left. Refer to #7 in the "Ar Rinci Ceili" book 2014.

Remember when you learned your "sevens" at the very beginning of your Irish dance career? For most of us, it was the very first right and left step we learned! Well, now is your golden opportunity to show how far your technique has come since those first classes! Dancers will compete their traditional "sevens" to 16 bars of beginner speed reel music. Technique is key!!

Requirement: Treble Jig @ speed 73, right and left side

Trad Set Roulette

Requirement: full trad set dance to be determined by a roll of the dice once dancers take the stage.

*For Champ level - Trad set dances may be any one of the standard 7 traditional set dances: St. Patrick's Day, Job of Journeywork, Blackbird, Jockey to the Fair, Garden of Daisies, Three Sea Captains, or King of the Fairies.

**For Non-Champ - traditional sets will be any one of St. Patrick's Day, Job of Journeywork, Blackbird, or Garden of Daisies.

Do you have to know all the dance options listed for your special? It's helpful! But you could also take a gamble and hope that one of the dances you do know comes up when the dice are rolled!

Requirement:

Teams of 2+ dancers, choreographed to music of choice, not to exceed 1 minute (*music will be stopped at the 1-minute mark*). Hard shoe and/or soft shoe permitted.

Music must be provided by the competitors on a device compatible with an auxiliary cord.

In honor of Charlotte’s love of all things creepy and macabre, team Halloween costumes with a somewhat “eerie” theme, are strongly encouraged!

On February 14th, 2020, one of our beginner dancers and her brother were struck by a distracted driver, leaving both of them in critical condition with life-threatening injuries. Heartbreakingly, Alex succumbed to his injuries, while his little sister Charlotte, continued to fight for her life. Charlotte continued to beat the odds at every turn but there were injuries that her body was unable to heal. While she is no longer able to dance, Charlotte loves to watch and listen to Irish dance.

Five years later, Charlotte is still the little fighter she has always been, but she needs ongoing care. All proceeds from this special will go towards Charlotte and her family, as they continue to seek treatments and supports that will provide her with a high quality of life.

We encourage creativity and interaction with your team! It can be a dance that the dancers themselves made up specifically for this competition, but can also be teacher choreographed specifically for this competition. It can be something you like to perform but haven’t been able to compete because you don’t have enough in the age group or it doesn’t fit with the competition rules. It can even be a few of your favorite treble reel or light shoe reel steps! It’s really just your opportunity to have fun with something more freestyle with your teammates.

Dear Dancers,

The Christine O’Riada special is in honor and memory of my mum.

My mum made Irish dancing what it is in Kansas City and was a staple in the Irish community there. But before she ever found her way to Kansas City, she came over to America as a dancer with the Brendan Boyer Royal Show Band and even spent a great deal of time performing in Las Vegas. It’s always been fun to be a first generation American but a second generation Las Vegas performer. It’s been an honor to follow in her footsteps.

As a teacher, it didn’t matter how many dancers my mum had, she knew how to put an entertaining show together. She was well known for it. But she wasn’t just good at coming up with crowd pleasing routines herself, she was excellent in encouraging her students to be a part of the process. Many of her students have gone on to perform in shows, create their own companies and schools, and are continuing to pass on that love of dance and performance to others around the country.

Growing up, my dance mates and I didn't have enough in any one age group to do figure choreographies at the major competitions, and we always wished we could compete some of our really fun performance numbers. But there weren't those types of competitions either! Treble reel competitions at the end of the day were our only chance to show off our creativity. So, when we were putting together our very first feis syllabus some years ago, our feis committee decided that we needed to have an event that would honor her love of choreography and performance and give any dancers who attend a chance to show off their own creativity, too.

We look forward to welcoming you all to Las Vegas for our feis! I hope you'll all sign up for this event but we are looking forward to hosting your fabulous dancing all weekend long. WUSR Level Advancement and Definition

First Feis:

- First Feis is not per dance, it is the first Feis ever for the dancer.
- Only one first feis regardless of how many dances they are doing.
- Dancers may only enter First Feis once, even in case of back-to back Feiseanna.

In B1, B2 and Novice the following will apply:

- 5 - 9 dancers: 1st place will advance to the next grade.
- 10 or more dancers: 1st and 2nd places will advance to the next grade.
- Dancers may not stay in level at Teacher discretion, with the exception of back-to-back feiseanna.

Prizewinner:

- Advancement from Prizewinner to Preliminary Championship is at teacher discretion.

Preliminary to Open Championship:

- Must have 3 overall wins with 5 or more dancers, not at teacher discretion.
- Upon winning 3rd overall win in Preliminary Championships, a dancer must move immediately to Open, even in the case of back-to-back Feiseanna.
- This includes 2 round and 3 round Preliminary Championships.

Adults:

- Dancers who started after the age of 18, or who have been out of competitions for 5 years.

Advanced Adults:

- An Advanced Adult dancer is defined as anyone age 18 or older who has previously placed in the top 3 of a Prelim Championship or competed in Open Champ levels in the youth/ & over levels regardless of when the competitor was active.
- An Advanced Adult dancer has opted to leave Youth/& over categories and once the dancer begins competing in Advanced Adult, the dancer may not return to Youth/& Over categories.
- Advanced Adult Championships at NAIDC 2024 and WUSR 2024 will dance Reel/hornpipe.
- In 2025, Advanced Adults shall follow the rotation of dances for the Senior Ladies/Men age groups.
- For the recall round, set of choice will be performed.

Beginner Figures:

- Open only to dancers in beginner for at least one solo dance.

Open Figures:

- Open to all grade levels.

LEVEL DEFINITIONS AND ADVANCEMENT RULES

First Feis is not per dance. It is the first Feis ever for the dancer. Dancers may only enter First Feis once, regardless of how many dances they are competing, even in the case of back-to-back Feiseanna.

In **Beginner 1, Beginner 2 and Novice** the following advancement rules will apply:

- Competitions with 5 - 9 dancers: 1st place will advance to the next grade.
- Competitions with 10 or more dancers: 1st and 2nd places will advance to the next grade.
- Dancers may not stay in level at teacher discretion, with the exception of back-to-back feiseanna.

Prizewinner: Advancement from Prizewinner to Preliminary Championship is at teacher discretion.

Preliminary to Open Championship:

- Dancer must have 3 overall wins in competitions with 5 or more dancers. Advancement to Open is not at teacher discretion.
- Upon winning 3rd overall win in Preliminary Championships, a dancer must move immediately to Open, even in the case of back-to-back Feiseanna. This includes 2-round and 3-round Preliminary Championships.

Adults: Dancers who started after the age of 18, or who have been out of Youth/&over competition for 5 years.

Advanced Adults: Dancers age 18 or older who previously placed in the top 3 of a Preliminary Championship or competed at the Open Championship level in the youth/&over levels, regardless of when the competitor was last active.

- Advanced Adults do not need to be out of competition for 5 years before moving from the youth/&over categories to Advanced Adults.
- Dancers who have already been competing in the regular Adult categories do not need to move to Advanced Adults, regardless of their level or placements achieved when competing in youth/&over.
- An Advanced Adult dancer has opted to leave Youth/&over categories, and once the dancer begins competing in Advanced Adult, the dancer may not return to Youth/&over categories.

Beginner Figures: Open only to dancers in beginner for at least one solo dance.

Open Figures: Open to all grade levels.
